## New Metric

The odds of getting both question right are $25 \%$. If you look in the Both\% column, you will see a few members who are beating the odds. Of interest are Members 1908 and 1918. Although their scores do not put them in the Leaders category, it does mean something significant: If they get the Test question right, they are more likely to have guessed the right answer for the Future question.

## Going Forward

I think we'll keep the current format.

A larger number of participants would likely give us more accuracy. If you ever took a stats class, you know how important the number 30 is.

I have not made any attempts to enlist additional members except once when I ask George Ure to invite his readers to join.

Lack of recruiting new participants has been intentional. It is time-consuming for me to run this experiment in the manual method I have been using.

Before attempting to recruit new members, I need to automate the process. A web page, link to a database, will allow you to simply click a button for the Test question, and another button for the Future question. You choices will go directly to a database from which questions, predictions, outcome and scores will be automated.

Of course, that will not happen until I can find the time, but I will eventual. The experiment has been interesting and produced results that call for us to move forward.
